Located in the basement of the Huntingdon Valley Library, the Valley Youth Center is a place for children in grades four, five, and six to interact with one another after school in a central area. Most of the children walk to the center from nearby Murray Avenue Elementary School.

Thinking of Building?

f you are planning any kind of remodeling project, please keep in mind that building permits are required for most repairs, additions, and alterations to properties. The Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code adopted by Lower Moreland includes the 2003 International Building Code as well as many other codes dealing with property maintenance.

What needs a permit: Work done to fences, sheds, decks, patios, both in-ground and above ground pools, driveways, driveway aprons, sidewalks and curbs, mechanical systems, all plumbing work, as well as most interior projects to kitchens, bathrooms, and garages.

What does not need a permit: Replacing windows and doors of the same size, gutters, siding, re-roofing (as long as there are no structural elements altered), painting, and tree removal or pruning.

If you are unsure if a permit is needed, please call the Code Enforcement Department at 215-947-3100.

Digging requirements: If you are contemplating landscaping or any kind of digging on your property you must call: PA One Call at 1-800-242-1776.
